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


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

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

### Rules of the game

- A sudoku puzzle is a grid of nine cells out of 9. This puzzle has 9 rows, 9 columns and 9 square areas of 3x3.
- You have to perfect the grid with figures from 1 to 9 without repeating the same value in the same column, row, or region.
- The resolution of a sudoku puzzle uses logic. No arithmetic calculation is useful for finding the solution.

### Brief history

- ~Sudoku's origins can be traced back to ancient civilizations, with tantalizing clues discovered in Egypt, Greece, and China. In the 18th century, these puzzle-like games evolved into the recreational pastime of "Number Place" in the United States, laying the foundation for the modern Sudoku we know today.
- ~The 1980s marked a pivotal moment for Sudoku, as it gained immense popularity in Japan. The game's simple rules, strategic gameplay, and calming effect resonated with the Japanese public, leading to numerous magazines, books, and even television shows dedicated to Sudoku.
- ~Emerging from Japan's shores in the 1990s, Sudoku embarked on a relentless journey to conquer the world. Its appeal crossed cultural boundaries, demographics, and age groups, captivating individuals from all walks of life. Sudoku puzzles appeared in newspapers, magazines, websites, and even mobile apps, making it accessible to billions worldwide.

### Rules of the game

- 1. Clues Provide Patterns: Each number alongside the grid represents a row or column in the puzzle grid. The number indicates the number of consecutive black squares in that row or column.
- 2. Deducing the Patterns: By analyzing the clues, players must deduce the patterns of black and white squares within the grid. The goal is to completely fill in the grid while adhering to the provided numerical clues.
- 3. Unveiling the Hidden Image: As players fill in the grid, they gradually reveal the hidden image that lies beneath. The completed puzzle will present a pixelated representation of the original image.

### About

- ~Nonograms, also known as "paint by numbers" puzzles, unveil hidden images within a grid of black and white squares. These pixelated masterpieces tantalize with their monochromatic simplicity, yet hold a hidden complexity that demands careful observation and deductive reasoning.
- ~Nonograms offer a captivating blend of visual and mathematical challenges. The game's puzzle grid is a canvas upon which numerical clues provide glimpses of the hidden image. Players must analyze the clues, deduce the puzzle's logic, and gradually uncover the hidden masterpiece.

### Rules of the game

- The puzzle consists of a grid of black and white squares.
- The white squares are filled with letters, forming words that cross each other horizontally (across) and vertically (down).
- The first white square in each entry is numbered to correspond to its clue.
- Each clue provides a hint about the word or phrase that should be entered into the corresponding numbered white square.
- Clues can be straightforward or wordplay-based, incorporating puns, anagrams, and other clever techniques to test the solver's knowledge and word skills.
- The minimum word length is typically three letters, with longer words considered more challenging.
- The puzzle should have a symmetrical layout and interconnected white squares, ensuring a sense of flow and continuity.
- Duplicate words are not allowed, adding an element of logic and eliminating guesswork.
- Theme entries, often related to a central theme or concept, weave together to enhance the puzzle's overall appeal.
